Forklift License Phoenix - Acquiring a forklift certification or forklift license in North America would require the trainee to perform classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators. Operators can acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial equipment which is designed together with various alternatives, like for example sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and a wide variety of types and sizes to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training programs are normally individualized in order to address the specific uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift in a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck in a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and businesses. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but rather on the results of individual training courses.

On the job training that is provided by the employer is the most common way of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who offers this method of certification is required to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machinery at their place of work. Employers may choose to train staff on every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The curriculum incorporates forklift operation methods, forklift maintenance, safety measures and company rules. Topics specific to the worksite, such as hazardous conditions or materials, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Normally, a certification provided by an employer will not transfer from the current employer to the next employer. Acquiring a lift truck license through employer-provided training permits the operator to run a lift truck for that particular employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an important aspect of the lift truck license training, although the particulars of the safety training will be dependent upon the equipment being utilized. Several safety problems would vary for every employer and industry. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for instance in offshore and marine operations.
